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1. Introducing LNG Stand Alone Send Out service

Thanks to performance improvements in current infrastructure, Fluxys LNG is able to offer 2.870 MWh/h of additional send out capacity under the form of Stand Alone Send Out available to all LNG terminal users at the same tariff as currently available Additional Send Out (see Fluxys' dedicated website page for monthly indexed tariffs).

2. Renaming Small Scale Berthing Rights into Stand Alone Berthing Right and expanding its scope to unloading operations

Small Scale Berthing Rights can currently only be used for LNG loading services¹. Fluxys LNG suggests to rename Small Scale Berthing Rights in Stand Alone Berthing Rights and to increase the optionality offered by this kind of berthing rights by adding LNG unloading services² next to the LNG loading services. Thanks to this enhancement, any Shipper holding a Stand Alone Berthing Right would be able to load or unload large and small scale vessels.

3. Aligning the LNG Terminalling Agreement with other agreements

The new proposed LNG Terminalling Agreement integrates amongst others a reviewed parent company rating provision to align with the provision from the LNG Services Agreement and LNG Transshipment Services Agreement.

4. Technical changes to the regulatory documents

The new proposed LNG Access Code reviews provisions such as access to EDP for GDPR compliancy reasons.
