

Consultation 48: proposed changes to regulatory documents for LNG Terminalling

December 22st, 2020

In a continuous effort to further secure the supply of natural gas to North-West Europe, Fluxys LNG considers a new expansion of its Zeebrugge LNG terminal in order to offer extra stand alone send out capacity.

Following the successful Open Season for additional regasification capacity at the Zeebrugge LNG terminal, Fluxys LNG undertakes the next steps in the regulatory approval process with a view to taking a final investment decision in February 2021 at the latest.

Therefore, Fluxys LNG presents in an adapted version of its LNG Programme its considered expansion and the capacity that would be available after the commissioning thereof.

Fluxys LNG also consults on the main elements of its amended tariff proposal that will include the investment in the Terminal expansion. Given the expected total amount of the investment, the additional operational expenses, the remuneration of the investment for the operator of the Terminal (under control and approved by the CREG) and the revenues generated by the subscribed capacity, the stand alone send out tariff will remain unchanged.
